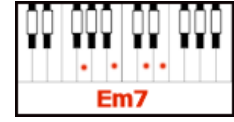
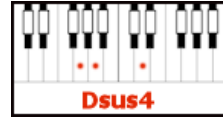
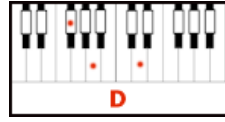


LUCKY MAN – Emerson, Lake & Palmer (G)
